District Accountability Committee (DAC)	DCSD Pathway expo – tonight is their November meeting and Eric will attend to learn about how the program is working for the district. CTE center for trades and technical education. The legacy campus provides 9 pathways such as teaching, nursing, culinary arts, aviation, computer science, etc. • Discussed if there should be more communication to our school parents about attending. Amy clarified the way the programs work. It is not a standalone school, and the students are still required to attend their home school. The districts provide additional support, it's more difficult for our students to attend and the scheduling is complex. Our counselors do one on one meetings with our juniors

and have added the pathways option to their meetings. We've had 3 students participate. Additional information provided from Paula and the training she attended. The other topic tonight will be SAC survey results. Eric filled out the survey and requested to have a DAC member attend one of our meetings. General sense of the DAC meetings is there is more interest in charter feedback. Fundraising - Mums Fundraiser raised over \$1000. • Fall family photo shoot happened on 11/16 and raised \$1100. Homecoming bake sale raised over \$600. • Book Fair in partnership with Barnes & Noble on 11/16. • Passive fundraisers continue with Box Tops and American Furniture Warehouse. - Homecoming recap The dance went well, students loved the theme and the addition of the DJ. Will plan for a DJ for Homecoming and Prom in the future. Students enjoyed the casino tables and food and had nothing but positive feedback. Our parents strongly supported the bake sale again, and we feel that it has been a great way to meet new volunteers and allow many parents to be involved.
- Halloween dance recap nearly all of the MS students attended. Will request to use the Commons for the dance next year. The outside

movie was a hit although there were some technical difficulties. It was good to have an additional activity. High school attendance was lower than anticipated, looking into ways to get more involvement from the high schoolers or switching to having this be a middle school only event. High school attendance was approximately 60-70 students. Middle school attendance was approximately 200 students. Prom- Prom is tentatively scheduled for 5/3. Lyndsey and Eileen are finalizing the venue scheduling, but the current plan is to have the dance at the Millhouse, and after prom at the Miller Activity complex. Eileen is obtaining contracts for both venues. Lyndsey will meet with students in February to decide on a theme. Adopt a family- volunteer Janice Gonzales is working closely with the students to help with adopt a family School is great! Book Fair – Shannon got to be one of the teachers that supported the event. Now that we know what we know, Shannon is volunteering again. She took her x-block group for an open mic presentation. They all read two poems, an original and an "OPP" other person's poem. It was awesome! Staff Update 8th Grade ELA class got to be part of a live webinar with the Natural Museum of Science. As a follow up lesson, she'll pull in Christina Shore for the legal perspective. The students will read Jurassic Park and prepare a case against the company, InGen. Xblocks are always fun. Excited to see what happens next quarter. Celebrations - Bread making collaboration with kitchen staff, science teacher connected with them. Brittnee has been working hard to elevate the athletics programs. Great new photographer for the teams. Had our mountain biking team compete. That team is growing. We try to promote it every year. It starts in summer. Volleyball is playing through October. Progressed to tournament play. Cross country had their first meet. They decided School Leader to cross the finish line together! A couple of our students placed 2nd Report and 4th. Have a MS cheer team. Boys basketball play begins in December. HS spirit team will perform during exhibition. Actively working to get into CHSSA. You have two years to complete the application and we're in the first year. Tom Smith and Brittnee are working together. Hoping within the next couple of years we'll be there and playing at a competitive level. We would be 2A and there's very few.

- Homecoming had a volleyball tournament. The sophomore team beat the seniors.
- She Kills Monsters had an adjudicator come out from Thescon to evaluate. They gave a ton of feedback. It was free for the school and provided valuable feedback.

TLCC Data -

• Another 2-year reporting rotation. Teaching and Learning Conditions Colorado survey. It's an anonymous survey. Compares our school to DCSD, state, other charters etc. Staff's overall impression of the school and future employment plans is 98%. It's the highest in the district. Had several 100% favorability ratings: led by an effective team, guided by a shared vision, showing respect for each other, comfortable raising important issues. 34 teachers completed the survey. Working through the feedback from the survey and evaluation. Use the district process but want something unique for RSS. Time was at 75% but that is low at every school. The results weren't surprising. Added asking EAs about their roles. The data is public!

SPF – School Performance Framework

- Uses this data to inform the UIP. Our ratings have stayed stable from 2023 to 2024. Compared to other schools in Castle Rock – our number is 82%, Castle View HS is 72%, DCSD is 70%. MS is 92%, CR MS is 57%, Mesa is 63%.
- Highlighted 96% on MS Academic achievement. The trends overall are stable.
- Have some disaggregated data that we're looking at.
- Academic achievement for MS still a small sample at our school at 18. Received 8/8 points for English. All 'exceeds' ratings.
- HS sample size is 25 All meets ratings.
- PSAT 85 students, Reading and writing, math all meets. Minority and students with disabilities were approaching and something we're looking at.
- 33 students took CMAS science and got a 'meets'.
- PSAT/SAT 91 students in reading and writing rated meets, 109 students in math rated 'exceeds'.
- Dropout rating has always been high and stable at 'exceeds'.
- Postsecondary readiness was a focus for our UIP, and this year we are at 85% (29/34), meets. Had a task force looking at the SPF. This is

	referencing the class of 2023 graduates, 30 kids. Improved to 'approaching'. Overall rating is 'meets'. • Reminder of what RSS is working on! Additional counseling added this year, signing day to celebrate whatever they decide to do, creating an elevated career fair.
	New HS Building — • It's always been the plan to have a HS building with athletics facilities. Current working plan is this building would be MS and then have another HS campus. Still discussing with the staff and evaluating options with architects to evaluate cost and get bidding. Putting all of that together right now. It would come up in January to submit intent.
